**Presentation - Water Well Management – Kim Yee (highlights)**

Mr. Yee addressed well construction, well maintenance and well abandonment.

- Well Construction
  - Good wells last a long time
  - Contractors must be licensed and must follow standards set by MOE
  - New and better caps for wells are available
  - Casing must sit above ground level and ground should be sloped away from the well
  - Water should be tested 4 to 5 times per year
- Well Maintenance
  - Items put around a well (fertilizer, manure, etc) will effect water quality of the well and others in the vicinity

- Well Abandonment
  - Unused wells must be sealed properly
  - See web site [www.ene.gov.on.ca](http://www.ene.gov.on.ca) - publications ground water or wells for more information

## **Presentation - Mark Green Senior Public Health Inspector (highlights)**

Mr. Green addressed water testing and septic systems

- Water testing
  - Containers and forms are available at the township office
  - Don't open cap on the container until ready to take the sample
  - Don't rinse the container
  - Run water 3 to 5 minutes before filling container – remove screen and aerator from tap
  - Make sure the end of the tap is clean (chlorinate)
  - Refrigerate sample – take to health unit the same day
  - Samples are picked up at the township office the first Tuesday of each month
- Septic Systems
 

Five Kinds:

  - Class 1 – Chemical Toilet
  - Class 2 - Grey water system
  - Class 3 - Cesspool
  - Class 4 – Leaching bed (most common)
  - Class 5 – Holding tank

Don't put anything in the septic system that is not biodegradable as it can kill the bacteria in the septic tank

Have the tank pumped every 3 to 4 years

How to recognize if the septic system is in need of repair

- Sewage smell
- Slow draining of toilets, sinks etc
- Water above ground in weeping bed area

If you can't find your septic tank or weeping bed, the Health Unit will assist for a fee of about \$100. if you have the name of the installer or the person who applied for the permit. See Health Unit website for more information: [www.healthunit.org](http://www.healthunit.org)

Municipalities are being encouraged to have a septic re-inspection program
